

CHAPTER 12.00 ELECTRICAL CODE

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TITLE, SCOPE AND CODE ADOPTED

12.01 TITLE.

This chapter shall be known as the “Electrical Code of the Village of Jackson” and referred to herein as “this Code.”

12.02 PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Code is to safeguard life and property by regulating the proper installation, maintenance and use of electricity and utilization devices by providing for the review and licensing of persons, firms and corporations undertaking electrical work, by issuing permits for electrical work, by inspections of existing and newly installed wiring, equipment and devices, and fixing a penalty for violation thereof.

12.03 SCOPE.

The provisions of this Code shall to all existing and new installations, reconstructions, alterations and extensions of electric and communication conductors and equipment within or on public and private buildings, structures and premises including mobile homes, parking lots, trenches and tunnels and industrial substations.

12.04 APPLICABILITY.

- (1.) Application.
This Code is applicable to all new installations, reconstructions, alterations and extensions of electrical wiring on the load side of the electrical service point of any building, structure, or other, utilizing electrical service.
- (2.) Existing Installations.
An existing installation may be required to be brought into compliance with this Code and within a specified time period if the electrical inspector determines there is a risk to life or property or the installation is not being used as originally installed.
- (3.) Change of Occupancy, Alterations or Damage.
If the type of occupancy of an existing premise is changed, the electrical wiring shall be made to conform to the requirements of this Code for the new type of occupancy. Any alterations to an electrical system shall conform to the requirements for a new installation. Any electrical system damaged by fire, lack of maintenance or other, shall be repaired/replaced to the requirements for a new installation.

12.05 CODE ADOPTED.

The provisions of this Code shall adopt and supplement all the laws and regulations of the State of Wisconsin relating to electrical installations and include any future amendments, revisions or modifications thereto. By this Section, these laws and regulations are made a part of this Code as if fully set forth herein. Where the requirements of the state Code and the provisions of this Code conflict, the stricter requirements shall govern. The following subsections reference, but are not limited to,

specific State of Wisconsin Administrative Codes that are part of this Code and the laws and regulations of the State of Wisconsin.

(1.) Wisconsin State Electrical Code, Volume 2.

Wisconsin Administrative Code, Chapter ILHR 16 titled Wisconsin State Electrical Code, Volume 2 is hereby adopted.

(2.) Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter ILHR 17.

Wisconsin Administrative Code, Chapter ILHR 17 titled Electrical Inspection and Certification of Electrical Inspectors and Master Electricians is hereby adopted.

(3.) Uniform Dwelling Code.

Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter ILHR 24 titled Electrical Standards applicable to one and two family new residential buildings is hereby adopted and is hereby applicable to alterations and additions to all existing one and two family residential buildings and their accessory buildings.

(4.) Illumination Code.

Wisconsin Administrative Code, Chapter IND 19, titled Illumination Code is hereby adopted.

(5.) National Electric Code.

Wisconsin Administrative Code Section ILHR 16.12, which adopts with amendments and incorporates by reference the National Code as adopted by the National Fire Protection Agency, is hereby adopted.

(6.) Public Service Commission Rules.

Wisconsin Administrative Code, Rules of the Public Service Commission, is referenced as part of this Code. Specifically, Chapters PSC 113, Service Rules for Electrical Utilities and PSC 114, WI State Electrical Code, Volume 1 are cited. Volume 1 adopts, with amendments, the National Electrical Safety Code (NESC), as promulgated by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers.

12.06 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this Code, the following terms and words shall be interpreted as having the following meaning:

(1.) Building Classification or Occupancy Classification.

The Building Inspector referencing the applicable ILHR Codes shall determine building classification or occupancy.

(2.) Completion of Work.

Completion of work shall mean completion of an electrical installation, whether partially finished or completely finished, by which the electrical inspector has made a final electrical inspection and has approved, partially or completely, the installation for its intended use.

(3.) Duly Qualified.

Duly qualified shall mean proof of a valid State of Wisconsin Master Electrician Certificate, or other equivalent license or certification issued by the State of Wisconsin, and further licensed by the Village of Jackson for any specialty license requirement to do electrical work.

(4.) Electrical Inspector.

Electrical Inspector shall mean any person duly certified for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this Code.

(5.) Electrical System/or Electrical Wiring.

Electrical System or Electrical Wiring shall mean all equipment, wiring, materials, fittings, devices, appliances, fixtures and apparatus used for the production, modification, regulation, control, distribution, utilization or safeguarding of electrical energy for mechanical, chemical, cosmetic, heating, lighting or similar purpose.

(6.) Licensed Electrical Contractor.

Licensed Electrical Contractor means any person, firm or corporation engaged in the business of erecting, installing, altering, repairing, servicing or maintaining electrical wiring who possess a valid electrical license, issued by the Village of Jackson, permitting such business to do electrical work in the Village of Jackson.

**SUBCHAPTER II
ADMINISTRATION, COMPLIANCE, LIABILITY**

12.07 ELECTRICAL INSPECTIONS.

Electrical Inspections shall be under the supervision of the Director of Building Inspection. The Director may employ qualified persons to aide in expediting any or all electrical inspections. The Director shall have, except where otherwise provided in this Code, the general management and control of all matters pertaining to electrical inspections and shall enforce all state laws and Village ordinances.

12.08 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR.

(1.) Authority.

The Electrical Inspector is authorized, directed and empowered to inspect any and all buildings, structures, and premises, public and private, and to, as herein provided, condemn and order removed or remodeled and put into safe condition for the prevention of fire and for safety of life and property, all electrical equipment installations and connections to electrical current for light, heat, power and/or communications purposes and to control the disposition and arrangement of the same so that persons and property shall not be in danger therefrom.

12.09 RECORDS.

There shall be kept in the Department of Building Inspections, a complete record of all permits, with their date of issue, and a record of all inspections made, to allow ready information concerning electrical installations.

12.10 INTERPRETATION BY THE ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR.

The Electrical Inspector shall have full authority to exercise judgement in a reasonable and proper manner and rule accordingly on all special cases in regard to any matters in this Code.

12.11 RIGHT OF ENTRY.

Whenever necessary to make an inspection to enforce any provision of this Code, or whenever the electrical inspector or authorized representative has reasonable cause to believe that there exists in any building or upon any premise, any condition which makes such building or premise unsafe the Electrical Inspector or authorized representative may enter such building or premises at all reasonable times to inspect the same or to perform any duty imposed upon by this Code, provided that if such building or premise be occupied, he/she shall first present proper credentials and request entry; and if such building or premise be unoccupied he/she shall first make a reasonable effort to locate the owner or other persons having charge or control of the building or premise and request entry. If such entry is refused, the inspector shall have recourse to the remedies provided by law to secure entry.

12.12 UNSAFE ELECTRICAL INSTALLATIONS.

(1.) Deemed Illegal.

All electrical installations which are unsafe and constitute a fire hazard, or otherwise dangerous to the life or property by reason of inadequate maintenance, overload, obsolescence, defector failure to conform to Code are hereby declared illegal and shall be abated by removal, repair or replacement in accordance with the following procedure.

- (a.) Whenever the Electrical Inspector shall find any electrical installation to be illegal as defined in this section, said inspector shall give to the owner, agent or persons in charge of the premises written notice stating the defects thereof. Said notice shall require the owner or those responsible to place the installation in a safe condition in accordance with the provisions of this Code within the stated time.
- (b.) Upon failure to comply with written notice, the Electrical Inspector shall have the authority to order the disconnection of electrical service, or portion thereof, and said service shall not be re-energized until written permission is given by the inspector.
- (c.) In case of emergency, or where necessary for safety to persons or property, or where electrical equipment may interfere with the work of the Fire Department, the Electrical Inspector shall have the authority to immediately disconnect or cause disconnection of any electrical service or equipment.

12.13 UNLAWFUL CONNECTION.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to make connection from a supply of electricity to any electric system or equipment until inspected and approved by the Electrical Inspector. Any electrical system or equipment ordered disconnected by the inspector shall not be energized until inspected and approved by the inspector.

12.14 UNLAWFUL INSTALLATION BY UNQUALIFIED PERSON.

It shall be unlawful to install new, alter existing or repair any electrical system or to do any electrical work unless the person, firm or corporation doing the work is duly qualified.

12.15 UNLAWFUL TO BREAK UTILITY SEAL.

It shall be unlawful for any person to break the seal of an electric meter, meter transformer or any other equipment sealed by the utility owning the same. When such seal has been broken, the owner utility shall immediately be notified. Any person observing a broken or missing seal shall immediately notify the owner utility.

12.16 UNLAWFUL TO SET METER.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to set a meter for electrical metering purposes, which has not been inspected and approved by the electrical inspector.

12.17 LIABILITY.

This section shall not be construed to relieve from or lessen the responsibility or liability of any person supplying electricity to, or selling, renting, leasing, owning, using, operating, controlling, installing, altering, repairing, removing, replacing, disturbing, connecting, disconnecting or maintaining any electrical equipment, for damages to persons or property caused by defect therein or therefrom; nor shall the Village be held as assuming any responsibility or liability by reason of the issuance or evocation of any license or permit, or by the inspection or reinspection authorized by this Code, or by reason of the approval or disapproval of any electrical equipment, sales, rentals, drawings, plans, specifications, materials, samples, test reports, literature, information or schedules authorized by this Code. Nor shall the Village of Jackson be held liable for any damages resulting from the enforcement of this Code.

12.18 APPEALS.

Any person, firm or corporation aggrieved by the decision of the Electrical Inspector shall have the right to file an appeal with the Zoning Board of Appeals for a review of said decision of the Electrical Inspector, provided the appeal is made in writing. Upon receipt of such appeal, the Zoning Board of Appeals shall proceed to determine whether the action of the Electrical Inspector complies with the intent of this Code and shall make a decision in accordance with its findings.

12.19 LICENSE REQUIRED.

(1.) Electrical License.

No person, firm or corporation shall engage in the business of installing, maintaining, altering or repairing any electrical system within the scope of this Code unless such person, firm or corporation has obtained from the Village of Jackson an electrical license.

(2.) Application.

Application for a license shall be submitted to the Building Inspection Department on forms supplied by the Village of Jackson. The applicant shall provide an original certification of Master Electrician issued by the Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations and some additional form of identification.

(3.) Effect of License.

When a license is issued to a person, firm or corporation, the license shall permit that person or company to procure electrical permits only for the use of the

licensee therein named upon the license and to do electrical work in the Village of Jackson as permitted by the specific license.

(4.) Guarantee of License Holder.

The issuance of a license, and renewals thereafter, shall be conditioned upon the guarantee of strict compliance by the license holder with all the Codes of the Village of Jackson, and the laws of the State of Wisconsin (ILHR 16, 17, IND 19, National Electric Code, and all other applicable codes), the orders of the Electrical Inspector and the payment of all fees and special assessments prescribed in this Code.

(5.) Termination of License.

The voluntary or involuntary termination of a license shall not relieve the license holder from completing and calling for required inspections (including final inspection) of all permits that have been issued to that license holder or payment of outstanding fees or assessments. All permits shall be completed within thirty (30) days of the termination of any license unless otherwise agreed to, in writing, by the inspector.

(6.) Not Transferable.

An electrical license is not transferable nor shall a license be loaned or rented.

(7.) Change of Status.

The license holder shall immediately notify the Building Inspection department of any change of address, contractor name, supervising electrician or any other pertinent fact pertaining to the license issued.

12.20 LICENSE RENEWAL.

All initial licenses shall expire on December 31 following the issuance of an original license. All renewal licenses shall be issued, following reapplication and payment of license renewal fee, for one (1) year commencing annually to January 1 and expiring on the following December 31. Any license not renewed prior to January 1 shall expire on February 1. Renewals for licenses will not be accepted after the February 1 date.

12.21 SUSPENSION OF LICENSE.

Any license granted under the provisions of this Code may be suspended by the Zoning Board of Appeals if the licensee violates any ordinance, law or code relating to electrical work or is guilty of electrical installations, which pose a hazard to life and/or property. The Zoning Board of Appeals shall not suspend any license until it shall have given the licensee at least a ten (10) day written notice to appear before it and show cause why the license should not be suspended.

12.22 REVOCATION OF LICENSE.

(1.) Should the Zoning Board of Appeals or the inspector find that any electrical issued by the Village of Jackson has been obtained by fraud, is being fraudulently used, or that the licensee has repeatedly violated this Code, the Board at its discretion may revoke the license. The Board shall not revoke any license until it has given the licensee at least a ten (10) day written notice to appear before it and show cause why their license should not be revoked. If revocation proceedings are continued over a period of time. The Board may suspend the license until the proceedings are finalized. When the Board revokes a license, no refund of fees shall be made to the holder thereof. When a license has been revoked the licensee shall not be eligible to apply for a new license for a period of one (1) year from the date of revocation.

(2.) Outstanding Permits.

Any holder of a license that has been revoked shall be required to complete all permits that have been issued to that license holder prior to revocation within thirty (30) days or other such time as directed by the Board.

12.23 SUPERVISING ELECTRICIAN.

(1.) Required for License.

An electrical license may be issued to any person, firm or corporation that appoints a supervising electrician who is employed permanently by the company. Such supervising electrician shall not just be an officer of the company. The supervising electrician shall supervise and be responsible for all work performed by the license holder and shall be available to the Electrical Inspector to discuss any matter involving electrical work permitted by the license holder.

(2.) Change of Status.

The Electrical Inspector shall be immediately informed by the license holder of any change of status of an appointed supervising electrician.

(3.) Electrical License Suspended.

In the event the supervising electrician resigns or is not able to perform as defined, the license holder or the supervising electrician shall immediately notify the Electrical Inspector. The license shall automatically be suspended until a qualified successor has been appointed.

12.24 ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS LICENSE.

(1.) Defined.

The holder of an Electrical Contractors License is permitted to engage in the business of and to secure permits for the installation, alteration and repair to any electrical system or electrical wiring upon or within any building, structure or premises in the Village of Jackson when supervised by an appointed supervising electrician.

(2.) Qualifications of Appointed Supervising Electrician.

The appointed supervising electrician must possess a valid State of Wisconsin Master Electrician Certificate or Restricted Master Electrician Certificate.

12.25 HOME OWNER LICENSE.

(1.) Defined.

License available to single-family owners who reside at the residence.

(2.) Scope.

This license allows holders to do any electrical within their dwelling except for service up-upgrades or service installations. This license cannot be used by owners of duplex residences or multi family buildings regardless of the owner residing in one of the units.

(3.) Qualifications.

- (a) Said owner shall legally own premises license is sought for.
- (b) Said owner must reside at the premises.
- (c) Owners must pass a written open book exam, with a minimum score of 70%. The test will be procured by staff and offered by appointment only.

(4.) Permits and Inspections.

The holder of a homeowner license shall require permits and call for inspections for the installation or alteration of any electrical work.

(5.) Access.

The Electrical Inspector shall have unrestricted access of the premises of the license holder at any reasonable time.

(6.) Change of Status.

The Department of the Building Inspection shall be immediately informed by the license holder of any change in status as the result of a sale of property and/or no longer residing at premises.

(7.) License Fee.

No fee will be assessed against homeowners.

**SUBCHAPTER IV
ELECTRICAL PERMITS, INSPECTIONS, FEES**

12.26 ELECTRICAL PERMIT.

(1.) Permit Required.

No building structure or premise shall be wired for electrical lights, meters, heating units, signs, refrigeration or other electrical wiring nor shall any electrical equipment be installed nor shall any alteration or change be made in any wiring system, nor shall electric current be supplied to any new electrical system before notifying the Electrical Inspector and securing a permit and/or authority to proceed with the work.

(2.) To Obtain a Permit.

A licensed contractor shall first file with the Electrical Inspector, an application for an electrical permit. The application shall state the name of the owner of the property, the address of the premises where the work is proposed, a description of all work proposed and other information as the Electrical Inspector may request. Required fees as prescribed by this Code shall accompany the application.

(3.) Temporary Work.

On applying for a permit for temporary work, a specified period of time for which such wiring is to remain in service shall be stated. Service shall be disconnected at the end of this period and shall not again be connected without written permission from the Electrical Inspector. For buildings where conduit wiring is required, special permits for temporary work may be granted by the Inspector for the installation of exposed wiring of lights and power for the building operations, display, decorative lighting, etc., for use for a limited period, subject to discontinuance and complete removal at expiration.

(4.) Emergency Work.

In the case of emergency work, the electrical contractor doing or causing work to be done shall report the same to the Building Inspection Department immediately after beginning work; and, such work shall be in accordance with the provisions of this Code.

(5.) Issuance of Permit.

(a.) No electrical work shall be performed until an electrical permit has been issued and proper fees have been paid for in the amount required by the fee schedule.

(b.) If upon examination it is found that the information on the application is complete, the Electrical Inspector shall issue an electrical permit.

- (c.) The Electrical Inspector may require the applicant to submit plans, drawings, specifications, schedules, literature or other materials, such as samples or test reports, as may be necessary to determine the compliance of equipment for safe installation and use.
- (d.) A fee may be assessed for plan review in accordance with the fee schedule.
- (e.) No other electrical work shall be done except work as described in the application for permit. Additional work not listed on the original permit shall require a new electrical permit to be secured prior to starting the new work.

12.27 ELECTRICAL PERMIT VOIDED.

The electrical permit shall have lapsed and be voided unless electrical work is commenced within one hundred twenty (120) days of the date of issuing of the permit or, if work authorized by the permit is suspended at any time after the work is commenced, for a period of one hundred twenty (120) days. Before such work can be recommenced, a new permit shall be first obtained. A written request from the permit holder, prior to termination, may extend the electrical permit up to an additional one hundred twenty (120) days. A permit that has lapsed and become void shall not relieve the permit holder of completion of the electrical work to a safe condition.

12.28 ELECTRICAL PERMIT REVOKED.

The Electrical Inspector may revoke a permit or approval issued under the provisions of this Code in case false statements or misrepresentation as to a material fact in the application or plans on which a permit or approval was based. A permit that has been revoked shall not relieve the permit holder of completion of the work to a safe condition.

12.29 ELECTRICAL PERMIT REFUSED.

No permit shall be issued to any licensee who is in arrears on the payment of any of the fees or special assessments or who has failed to comply with any outstanding lawful order of the Electrical inspector.

12.30 APPROVAL OF OTHER PERMIT.

The approval or conditional approval of a building, plumbing or HVAC permit shall not be considered as approval of the electrical plans, electrical specifications, electrical equipment or of an electrical permit.

12.31 WORKING WITHOUT A PERMIT.

- (1.) Authority of the Electrical Inspector.

When any work is begun on the installation or alteration of an electrical system or to the installation of new or replacement of any electrical equipment without first obtaining an electrical permit therefore, except emergency cases, the

disconnection immediately of any such equipment or electrical system and to stop work until a permit has been procured.

(2.) Penalty.

When obtaining an electrical permit after the work has commenced, the total fee shall be doubled with a minimum fee in accordance with the fee schedule.

(3.) Compliance.

The payment of such double fees shall not relieve the permit holder from fully complying with all the regulations of this Code or from any other penalties prescribed by the Code.

(4.) Emergency.

The Electrical Inspector shall make the determination as to the existence of an emergency.

12.32 INSPECTIONS.

(1.) When Required and Notifications.

Upon completion of electrical wiring required to be inspected as hereafter stated or before any electrical wiring is to be hidden from view, the electrical contractor installing the electrical wiring shall notify the Electrical Inspector that the installation is ready for inspection. The request for inspection shall include the permit number and location of work to be inspected.

(2.) Inspection of Work.

The Electrical Inspector shall perform the requested inspection within two (2) business days, exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, after receiving notification. If after two (2) business days, an inspection has not been made, the contractor shall inform the Electrical Inspector of his or her intention to proceed with the work.

(3.) Inspection Types.

Inspections required to be performed shall be of the following types for the purpose of determining if the work complies with this code:

- (a.) A rough-in inspection before concealment of the electrical wiring or raceway piping; includes ceiling;
- (b.) Final Inspection for releasing the installation for its intended use; and,
- (c.) Reinspection, as necessary, to conform compliance and satisfactory completion of the electrical work.

(4.) Access.

The electrical contractor shall provide access for any inspection which is not readily accessible for an inspection such as, but not limited to, roof tops, tunnels, etc.

(5.) Approval.

If it is found that the installation complies with this Code, the Electrical Inspector shall post a notice of approval of same and authorize concealment of the electrical wiring, connection of electrical service or final inspection approval of the installation for its intended use.

(6.) Connection.

For connection of a new relocated electrical service to any building, structure or premise, the Electrical Inspector shall issue a certificate of inspection the electric company furnishing electrical power and the power company shall not energize said service until receiving approval from the Electrical Inspector.

(7.) Disapproval.

If the installation is incomplete or not strictly in accordance with this Code, the Electrical Inspector shall post a rejection notice. The notice shall not be removed until approved by the Electrical Inspector. The electrical contractor installing the faulty installation shall remove all hazards and make necessary changes or additions within seven (7) days and call for a reinspection. A reinspection fee will be assessed for the reinspection.

(8.) Authority to Remove.

The Electrical Inspector shall have authority to cause the removal of any obstruction which may prevent the proper inspection of any electrical equipment. Concealment of electrical work before inspection by any person is a violation of this Code.

(9.) Final Inspection.

The electrical contractor shall promptly call for a final inspection when work is completed and before the electrical installation is used for its intended purpose. It is the responsibility of the electrical contractor to insure the electrical installation is safeguarded until approved by the Electrical Inspector. A penalty fee may be assessed for failure of the electrical contractor to promptly request a final inspection.

12.33 WORK TO BE SAFEGUARDED.

All energized work shall be protected during construction.

12.34 FEE SCHEDULE.

12.35 REINSPECTION FEE.

When additional inspections are required because of failure to comply with code requirements, additional permit fees may be assessed as listed in the fee schedule.

12.36 FAILURE TO CALL FOR FINAL INSPECTION.

An additional fee may be assessed, as listed in the fee schedule, for failure of a permit holder to call for a final inspection for completion of work for which an electrical permit was issued. The assessment may also be applied when the electrical contractor allows use of the electrical installation before the Electrical Inspector finally approves the installation.

12.37 PAYMENT OF FEES TO THE VILLAGE TREASURER.

All permit fees shall become property of the Village of Jackson and shall be delivered to the Village Treasurer and credited to the general fund.

**SUBCHAPTER V
VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES**

12.38 VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.

(1.) Violation.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to erect, construct, install, alter, repair, move, demolish, convert, equip, use occupy or maintain any building, structure or premise in the Village contrary to or in violation of any provision of this Code to cause, permit or support the same to be done.

(2.) Penalties.

Any person, firm or corporation that shall violate any of the provisions of this Code shall forfeit not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) or more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each violation, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs shall be confined in the Washington County House of Correction until such forfeiture and costs are paid, for not more than the number of days set forth in sec. 800.095(4) of the WI Stats. Each and every day during which any such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.

(3.) Injunctive Action and Abatement.

In addition to the penalties provided in subsection (2), appropriate legal or equitable action may be commenced to obtain compliance or enjoin any person, firm or corporation from violating any of the sections of this Code.
