Yard waste should be placed in a biodegradable paper bag. A previous calendar incorrectly showed April 23rd.

Please be prepared to show identification to verify Village of Jackson residency.

## BRUSH CHIPPING and YARD WASTE

Chipping and Bag Pick-up will begin on Monday, May 2nd, and continue each Monday, until Tuesday, May 31st (the day after the Memorial Day Holiday.) During the summer months brush will be chipped and yard waste, placed in biodegradable bags, will be picked up on the third Monday **only** of the month. The dates are June 20th, July 18th, August 15th, and September 19th (or after a storm.) **Bags containing only fresh grass clippings will be tagged and will not be picked up.**

## *From the Desk of the Village President . . .*

With the spring elections just finished, I'd like provide a quick update on Village officeholders.

Congratulations to newly-elected Trustee Debbie Kurtz, who will fill the seat vacated by Trustee Scott Mittelsteadt. Debbie's been attending many public meetings over the last several months to become acquainted with what's going on in the Village. I look forward to working with her and hearing her input on issues of importance to the Village and its residents. Congratulations also to incumbent Trustees John Kruepke and Mike Kufahl, who were each voted into another two-year term on the Village Board in the April 5<sup>th</sup> elections. Board incumbents Brian Emmrich, Don Olson, and Jack Lippold have another year left in their current terms, and I have another year left in my term as Village President.

If you ever have questions or concerns with Village matters, feel free to contact any Village Board member. Any Village Trustee will either be able to assist you with your question, or point you in the right direction to get you the answers you need. Phone numbers and email addresses are listed on the Village website and in this newsletter. Also, feel free to contact Village Staff at (262) 677-9001 with any question you may have regarding Village policies or events.

In other news, the Plan Commission is in the process of reviewing and updating the 2035 Comprehensive Plan, available on the Village website. When their review is complete, the Plan Commission will forward a recommendation to the Village Board that an addendum be issued containing updated information to the Comprehensive Plan.

At its March 31 meeting, the Plan Commission also recommended that the Village Board approve requested water and sewer connections for a dormitory at Living Word Lutheran High School in the Town of Jackson. A project like this demonstrates the importance that governmental neighbors maintain a proper respect for each other and build good working relationships with each other so that projects like this are not delayed unnecessarily.

Fox Brothers Piggly Wiggly is looking at ways to improve their parking lot and access to their store. Their contractor presented preliminary plans at the last Plan Commission meeting for what should be an exciting facelift.

Plans are in the works for the reconstruction of Wilshire Drive, which is slated to begin in the next several weeks, pending Village Board approval. This project links the installation of storm sewers, and upgrading water mains and sanitary sewers as needed with the road reconstruction, and provides the gas and electric utility an opportunity to upgrade their infrastructure at the same time. When complete, residents will also enjoy the new widened sidewalks that will be installed.

I'm looking forward to the opening of Coffeeville, slated to open in early June. The owner, Jack Kulwikowski, is completing the final stages of an impressive restoration project on the historic log building in preparation for an early June opening. He has spent an incredible amount of time and effort converting the log farmhouse into a stylish two-story setting with fireplace and balconies, and noted that Village staff was extremely helpful in getting the project through the design and building phases. I'm sure the restoration will be impressive, but more than that, I can't wait to come in and enjoy the roasted-on-site coffees, chocolates, and pastries.

For another kind of flavor, Sprecher Brewery will have a truck on site in Jackson Park beginning June 16<sup>th</sup>, and running through June 25<sup>th</sup>. Coordinated around Music in the Park, special entertainment events and food vendors are in the works for this exciting first-ever effort. Check out the Parks and Recreation section of this newsletter for more information about this authentic German-style beer garden in Jackson Park.

Finally, I wish to thank two individuals for their great contributions to the Village of Jackson. Fire Chief John Skodinski has retired after serving 27 years. His dedication and service to the Village and the surrounding areas our fire department serves are greatly appreciated. Thank you for your service, John!

Also, Scott Mittelsteadt has served the Village of Jackson as a former Village President and, in addition to serving on other boards and committees, as a Village Trustee. Your thoughtful input and conscientious attitude in service to the community over the years are also greatly appreciated.

You will both be missed, and we wish you the best in the years to come.


