Subject: Weekly Update



### **Police Department**

It's been a busy week, including three OWI arrests over three days. There were also some problems with intoxicated carnival workers.

All preparations have been made for the parade.

### **Fire Department**

There were eight medical calls through the week. Most of the calls were serious and required immediate transport to the hospital.

Last weekend began with a swimming pool explosion. The pool liner broke causing water to rush out, damaging the pool heater/gas line, causing the malfunction. The JFD responded to a Hazardous Materials call at Gehl Foods in Germantown, to assist in the mitigation of two chemicals that were accidentally combined. More than 100 employees were forced to exit the building. Our crew entered the building to assess the release of deadly gases, contained, and quickly mitigated the problem.

The JFD was proud to be a part of the Operation FINALLY HOME dedication last Saturday. A 15 x 25 foot American flag was hung from the top of the extended ladder truck in front of the two houses – an awesome sight.

Monday evening training was a work night. All the fire apparatuses, ambulances, and vehicles were washed and waxed in preparation for Sunday's Action in Jackson parade.

### **Joint Parks and Recreation**

We have been busy all week with Action in Jackson and preparing for the Beer Garden – see last page.

JACC is in full swing this week. Boys & Girls Club and Tot Time began summer sessions on Monday.

Renee took a busload of seniors to Potawatomi on Tuesday. Fun was had by all.

### **Building Inspection**

A final inspection was completed at the Coffeerville Company on Main Street. A few minor items were found and are being corrected. A soft opening of the business is scheduled for Saturday, June 18. The official grand opening will be sometime in August.

Work continues in catching up on complaints and permit applications.

## **Public Works**

The Jackson Water Utility continued its normal routine of Digger's Hotline locates, meter changeouts, radio programming, and fire hydrant maintenance. The crew was busy with the Wilshire Drive reconstruction project with the final tie-ins at Jackson Drive and Chateau Drive. The water main installation is now complete.

The Street & Parks Department also continued its routine general building and vehicle maintenance, replaced broken trash containers, and mowed various Village locations. The American flags have been temporarily installed on Main Street for Action in Jackson and Flag Day, using the old brackets. The new swivel brackets, to keep the flags from being tangled on the poles, have not yet arrived. The asphalt by Jackson Park ball diamond was repaired after the sewer lateral was repaired. Jackson Park is being prepared for the big festival this weekend. Thirty-two logs are ready for carving. The parade detour route has been delineated. Barricades for the parade route and many more details are being completed.

At the WWTP, the rotating bridge on Clarifier #2 stopped functioning. Pieper Electric repaired it by installing a new slip ring. The bar screen has now been repaired and is being placed into operation. During the repair, items that should not be flushed down the toilet were removed. The level in each tank will be lowered to remove debris. Staff attended the collection seminar in Watertown. Sanitary sewer lateral televising continues in the Wilshire Drive reconstruction project.

The Wilshire Drive reconstruction project will continue with storm lateral installations and final sump pump discharge connections. These are being done by the Jackson Sewer Utility. Nine more laterals need to be installed. Catch basins will be brought to final grade and sanitary manholes will be adjusted.

## **Administrator**

An interesting presentation was given by a "millennial" in West Allis this week on generational differences; how those differences are affecting today's workforce, and how to deal with the changes.

The mediation process continues as ordered by the Court, as an alternative to a long trial, in the lawsuit brought about against the Village of Jackson by the Town of Jackson and the Jackson Town Residents Against Attachment (JTRAA.) The Village awaits the response from the Town to its last proposal.

Thursday evening, the Town of Jackson Board unanimously denied funding for reconstructing Cedar Creek Road. The much needed reconstruction project for the badly deteriorating road was to be a joint effort with the Village to also enhance the road cross section with a recreational path, jointly planned for in the Joint Village and Town of Jackson Comprehensive Plan: 2035. Both communities have obtained grant commitments from the State for the project. It now becomes necessary for the Village to quickly propose a different project to enhance a Village road to still be able to utilize the committed funding.

On a positive note, the Village of Jackson warmly welcomed its newest residents: the Wroblewskis and the Kitelingers – Recipients of the two Operation FINALLY HOME houses, in an emotional COMMUNITY dedication ceremony last Saturday morning, June 4. The ceremony was completed just in time for the new landscaping to be well watered by the pouring rain.

It looks to be incredible weather this weekend for Action in Jackson. We'll see you there.
