Subject: Weekly Update



Police Department

It was an extremely busy week in terms of calls for service. There were four OWI arrests over the weekend, bringing the two week total to seven.

There were three disturbances involving intoxicated carnival workers. One of them, an Alabama woman, had to be taken to the hospital because she became incoherent. This happened on Tuesday before Action in Jackson actually started. None of the incidents were serious enough to warrant arrest and AIJ patrons weren't involved. These were the first such problems in many years. Otherwise, Action in Jackson and Sunday's parade went smoothly.

Officers received annual certification for the Tasers and training in the use of tactical tourniquets. Each officer carries a tourniquet in case they or another officer or civilian are shot, stabbed, or injured.

Fire Department

Work continues to bring the JFD building up to par. The furnaces that are no longer functional will be replaced. The Firefighter's Association has been working on updating the kitchen. We are also preparing for the arrival of our gear washer. All truck maintenance has been completed. The bad news is that the transfer case needs to be repaired on our main engine. The engine will be transported to Markesan on July 11th for the repair. It will be out of service for about a week.

The JFD enjoyed Action in Jackson. We were happy that there were no injuries during the event and all survived Saturday's heat and humidity.

There were ten medical calls and two fire calls this week. Stay safe during the week-long (Beer Garden) festival going on at Jackson Park. Keep watch on the streets as all the children are now on summer break.

“Well Washington County” consortium met at the Community Center on Wednesday.

The 4K Directors met on Wednesday and are gearing up with all the formalities of running the 4k program in the fall. We hope to have a teacher hired in the near future.

The Jackson Farmer's Market (in Jimmy's parking lot) will officially open on Thursday, June 30th and run through the month of October.

Building Inspection

A rough inspection was completed at the second twelve-family apartment building in Cranberry Creek this week. The building permit was issued this week for the fifth and final building in the project.

The sanitary sewer and storm laterals were installed at Lumber Sales on Delaney Court. The water service will be live-tapped beginning today (Friday.)

A final re-inspection is scheduled at the Coffeerville Company on Main Street. The owner will be opening up for business beginning tomorrow (Saturday.)

It has been very busy this week with inspection requests.

Public Works

The Jackson Water Utility continued with routine Digger's Hotline locates, meter installations, radio programming, and fire hydrant maintenance. The crew repaired a water valve box near the Green Valley office that was damaged by winter snow plowing. The repair was done prior to their paving of the area. There are only eight meters remaining to be changed out in this year's program. The first quarter billing disconnection process was completed June 13th with 209 customers on the disconnection list constituting \$47,082.16 in unpaid utility revenues. There were 119 customers that were unable to be shut off; forty-four that paid in full or began payment plans, and forty-six were disconnected. A list of eight remaining properties has been turned over to the Building Inspection Department for a lack of potable water.

The Street & Parks Department conducted routine building and vehicle maintenance, replaced broken trash containers, and mowed Village properties. Jackson Park has been cleaned after Action in Jackson and readied for the ten day Beer Garden event. June bag and brush pickup is scheduled for Monday, June 20th. Property owners have been notifying the Village of dead or dying street trees. Three ash trees and a maple tree were removed. Replacements will be replanted in the fall.

At the WWTP, the bar screen is now working properly. General maintenance and work orders have been completed. The grease receiving station project is beginning with the removal of the existing hut in order to install the new grinder pump.

The Wilshire Drive Reconstruction project continues. All storm laterals have been installed for sump pump discharge, with only two to go. A plumber will do the remaining inside work. Curbing is scheduled to be poured on Monday, June 20th, with sidewalk and driveways to follow. Homeowners are being notified that, beginning Monday, they will have no access to their driveways for the next two weeks, to allow for proper cure time of the concrete.

Clerk/Treasurer

The Annual scheduled maintenance on the new election equipment was completed.

The Liquor License Report was filed with the Wisconsin Department of Revenue.

The Cigarette / Tobacco License report was sent to the state.

Letters for Delinquent Personal Property Taxes have been sent out again.
