Subject: Weekly Update



Police Department

Calls for service were down in the past week, but among them were arrests for OWI (x2), domestic violence/disorderly conduct, and physical abuse of a child.

Officers have been scheduled to attend training on the new vehicle accident reporting form launching January 1. Training is four hours at WCTC or the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Academy in Franklin.

Officer Oswald has scheduled quarterly Defense and Arrest Tactics training later this month.

Firearms qualification was completed.

The District Attorney determined that Officer Henning's use of force on July 1 was justified because it was necessary to save the victim's life. Kyle has returned to duty.

Fire Department

There were thirteen medical calls this week involving thirty patients. Eighteen patients were treated for heat exhaustion at the Donald Trump rally at the County Fairgrounds. Conditions deteriorated quickly when the air conditioning could not keep up with the number of participants inside. Additional help was received from West Bend, Richfield and Germantown Fire Departments, and Lifestar.

Monday night training consisted of an active shooter drill with the Jackson Police Department. It was a great experience for us as this was first-time training for most. It allowed us to work closely with the police department and learn from each other how we would work together to accomplish the main objective. A big thank you also goes out to the participants that aided in being "patients."

Carpets have been steam cleaned in all areas of the JACC. Thank you to Greg Rathke for doing such an outstanding job. It took two full days. Repairs are being made throughout the building after a busy summer with the Boys & Girls Club.

Building Inspection

Four additional certificates of occupancy were issued this week for building #1 in Cranberry Creek.

Interior remodeling continues at the Piggly Wiggly. The floor was poured in the new addition and under floor plumbing was installed for the new bathrooms and break room in the former liquor store area.

Inspections continue to be very steady.

Public Works

The filter bypass gate was installed at the WWTP, but the actuator sent was the wrong one. The manufacturer's rep will take care of their mistake. Filter #2 is down for repair. The back-flush pump motor was repaired and the drum motor gear drive will either be repaired or replaced. Replacement filter membranes have been ordered. Clarifiers #3 and #4 are back online after the bypass gate replacement. The old clarifiers (#1 and #2) were used during the gate replacement. Seasonal jetting will begin next week east of the railroad tracks and north of STH 60. As a precaution, for the next couple of weeks, keep your toilet seat lids closed "just in case."

The new valve exerciser was repaired and returned to the Water Department but was damaged during shipment; so it's back to the repair shop. Valve exercising continues, as well as meter and radio installations, along with the routine Digger's Hotline locates.

The Street Department has been working to clean up the entrance sign areas, trimming shrubs, and cleaning islands of weeds. The deck arms on the 2009 mower are being replaced. Lawn mowing continues along with brush chipping, bag pickup, weed spraying, and routine maintenance.

Clerk/Treasurer

Deanna attended the 36th annual Wisconsin Municipal Clerks Association Conference this week. Discussions included updates on elections with the Elections Commission, liquor licensing with the Department of Revenue, and open meetings laws.

Administrator

It was determined this week that the Mid-Moraine Municipal Court administrative offices will move to a new location in West Bend beginning in January of 2017. The new location will be in the Educators Credit Union building on W. Paradise Drive at USH 45.

While the Town of Jackson approved a motion at their August 11 meeting to adopt a resolution to proceed with mediation with the Village, ultimately to arrive at an agreement regarding the attachment of certain properties, we continue to wait for the Town to adopt the resolution itself. We are told that they will be scheduling a special Town Board meeting for that purpose.
