JACKSON ELEMENTARY 4 & 5 YR-OLD KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Four and five year-old kindergarten enrollment for the 2017-18 school year will be held at Jackson Elementary School on the corner of Highway 60 and Jackson 4 Drive. VILLAGE AND TOWN OF JACKSON BOUNDARY AGREEMENT

The court-ordered mediation continues between the Village of Jackson and the Town of Jackson and citizen group Jackson Town Residents Against Attachment (JTRAA), who filed suit against the Village in late 2014, arguing that the long-standing boundary agreement between the Village and town (since 1999) was illegal. The court ruled in favor of the Village that the agreement was indeed legal but failed to make a decision in the fourth and final count, that the attachment of the subject town properties may not have been correctly executed.

There have been three mediation sessions, with a fourth one in the process of being scheduled. The Village has been the conciliatory party to date, but that has not been sufficient for the other two parties.

No more than two (2) dogs and two (2) cats may be licensed for any one residence.** Exceptions may be requested by application to the Plan Commission and Village Board for a Conditional Use Permit or PUD amendment.

THE JACKSON FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Jackson Fire Department (JFD) ambulance service is reaching new heights. Additional personnel are being trained to meet the highest level of Advanced EMT. The implementation of policies and procedures, protocols, and higher level training is shown to improve the quality of care to patients. Fire Chief Swaney is proud of our community's great ambulance service and hopes to increase our levels of service in 2017.

Congratulations to the three newest members: John Schut, Andie Meidam, and Andrew Tinlan for passing the National Registry Basic EMT course; and to Ryan Ganshow for gaining his Firefighter II state certification.

The JFD has also installed two new modern ambulance cot loading systems, updated its EMS computers and software, purchased new gear, and instituted updated equipment maintenance programs.

From the Desk of the Village President . . .

Happy New Year!

I hope you had a great holiday season!

A few things happened just before the close of the year that I want to bring you up to date on. On November 3, 2016, the statewide Wisconsin Park and Recreation Association honored Village of Jackson resident Casey Latz with their Honorary Fellowship Award in recognition of her contributions to the Jackson Area Parks and Recreation Department. Congratulations, Casey, and thank you for the many things you do for our community!

In late November the Village purchased the old ABC building on Eagle Drive. The building had been vacant for some time and became available to the Village for use by the Village of Jackson Water Utility and Street Departments. The building is in good condition, is in an excellent location for Village use (adjacent to the wastewater treatment plant), has sufficient space to serve the Village for many years to come, and was purchased for an amount well below the asking price.

The slate of candidates for Village of Jackson offices is set for the April 4th Spring Election. The deadline to submit candidacy documentation for the Spring Election was January 3rd. No new residents chose to run for public office, but each incumbent office-holder whose term current is about to expire submitted proper documentation to have their names placed on the ballot again. They are Brian Emmrich (Trustee), Jack Lippold (Trustee), Donald Olson (Trustee), and Mike Schwab (Village President).


