## JACKSON AND ITS CONNECTION TO THE CEDAR CREEK WATERSHED

### OUR CONNECTION WITH CEDAR CREEK

Water that does not soak into the ground or evaporate is called stormwater runoff. Stormwater runoff flows over the ground surface and then into storm drains and ditches that empty directly into our local waterways. This is especially true in cities, villages, and other developed areas because water cannot soak through the pavement, rooftops, or concrete. This means that there is more stormwater runoff generated in cities and villages than in forests and fields.

Urban stormwater runoff contains pollutants from roads, parking lots, construction sites, industrial storage yards, and lawns. Unlike sanitary sewers which collect wastewater from homes and businesses and convey it to a wastewater treatment plant, storm sewers are separate pipes that collect stormwater runoff from inlets, catch basins, or drains located along street curbs and in parking areas.

At the State level, and to meet the federal requirements of the Clean Water Act, the DNR developed the Wisconsin Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (WPDES) Stormwater Discharge Permit Program, which is administered under the authority of Ch. NR 216, Wis. Adm. Code. More than two hundred municipalities in Wisconsin including cities, villages, towns, and counties within urbanized areas are required to have Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permits under this code. The Village of Jackson is among them.

Join the Village of Jackson, Washington County Land Conservation, and the Farmers of the Cedar Creek Watershed on Saturday, September 7<sup>th</sup> from 1:00-5:00 p.m. at N168 W19677 Main Street (formerly known as the Schmahl Farm) for a FREE agricultural and urban event called the Cedar Creek Community Connection, educating those living in and around the Village, with hands-on activities for kids and adults! Live musical entertainment will be provided by the Freshwater Bluegrass Band. Food and refreshments will be available in the social tent.

Visit with farmers of the Cedar Creek Watershed. Learn about their soil conservation efforts to improve water quality and help protect our surface water and groundwater resources.

There will be fun Agricultural Connection hands-on learning experiences with different types of soils and crops, tractors, and other equipment.

Employees of the Village of Jackson, Riveredge Nature Center, Milwaukee Riverkeeper, Sweet Water, Lamms Gardens, and others will be there to answer your questions on urban conservation practices; with additional Urban Connection activities on watershed "run-off", storm drains, leaf pollution, bugs in the stream, and how your flushed water is treated. These activities will open your eyes to everyday conservation.

## From the Desk of the Village President . . .

Great things are happening in the Village of Jackson!

You've probably noticed developers moving forward with several residential projects in the Village.

Bielinski Homes is in the process of installing infrastructure for Addition #1 of their Laurel Springs single family subdivision, and a condo development on the northwest corner of Cedar Creek Road and Jackson Drive. Improvements to the portions of Cedar Creek Road and Jackson Drive contiguous to those developments are also in progress. We look forward to those improvements being completed.

The Village Board also approved plans for the development of Maplewood Farms, a single family subdivision south of Sherman Road and west of Maple Road. Dittmar Realty is working to make progress on that project as quickly as possible.

PRE/3 Properties received approval to begin work on a multi-family project east of County Trunk Highway P north of Rosewood Lane.

A concept plan was approved for property at the northwest corner of Highway P and Sherman Road. Developer Bill Carity is planning a single family, conservation-friendly development for the area, subject to Village approval of his request for annexation to the Village.

The landscaping still needs to be completed, but kids and parents alike love the new inclusive playground at Hickory Lane Park. If you haven't been there to see it yet, go check it out. It's an awesome playground! Thanks to the many people who contributed to making the playground project a great success!

Finally, the police and fire chiefs, along with Village administration, have been visiting municipalities to get ideas for the Village of Jackson's new municipal building. The Board recently directed planners to work toward a structure suitable to house both safety and administrative duties for the Village. This will eventually allow the existing Village Hall campus to be eliminated for anticipated long-term savings to the Village.

Thanks to all of you who think, plan, and work to make the Village of Jackson the best it can be!

### SUMMERTIME SAFETY TIPS FROM THE JACKSON FIRE DEPARTMENT

#### Outdoor Grilling with Charcoal and Propane

- ◆ Be very careful when lighting grills.
- ◆ Only use recommended charcoal lighter fluid.
- ◆ Never grill indoors.
- ◆ Keep grills away from buildings and from under eaves.
- ◆ Have a three foot "Kids Safe Zone" around grill.




#### Fire Pits

- ◆ Metal manufactured type fire pits are preferred.
- ◆ Fire pits must be made entirely of noncombustible materials.
- ◆ No burning within fifteen feet of any building or lot line.
- ◆ Fire should be under the constant supervision of an adult.
- ◆ Never use flammable liquids to start a fire.
- ◆ Always extinguish fire and cover fire pit when done.



#### Swimming Safety

- ◆ Never swim alone! Swim with a buddy; it's more fun and much safer.
- ◆ Never leave young children unattended near the water.
- ◆ Young swimmers or inexperienced swimmers should wear a life jacket.
- ◆ Maintain supervision of your children while they are swimming.
- ◆ Secure your pool when not in use.
- ◆ If a child is missing, check the pool first. Seconds count.
