## MUNICIPAL COMPLEX CONSTRUCTION BEGINS!



The physical task of constructing the long-awaited Village Municipal Complex began in mid-May with the mobilization of equipment to the 6.7 acre site on the south side of STH 60 at Ridgeway Drive. The complex will become the new home of the Jackson Police Department, Fire Department, and Village Hall. The project is expected to take up to sixteen months to complete, with occupancy slated for mid-September 2021. Mike Koenig Construction is the contractor.

In addition to the Municipal Complex, two streets are being extended — Spruce Street east to Eagle Drive and Ridgeway Drive south to the new Spruce Street extension.

The majority of the site grading, stormwater pond excavation, and building pad are half-way to completion. After encountering some soil stabilization issues, the project appears to be back on track.

Sewer and water installation, underground plumbing, and foundation excavation will begin soon.

A number of permits are required by different governmental agencies for the construction of the Municipal Complex. A sample of those permits already approved follows:

- WDNR-Storm Water Notice of Intent
- WDNR-Chapter 30
- US Army Corp-General
- WDNR-Water Main Extension
- WDNR-Sanitary Sewer Extension
- WDSPPS-Plumbing Conditional Approval
- WDSPPS-Building and HVAC Conditional Approval
- FEMA-Conditional Letter of Map Revision
- WisDOT-Work in Right-of-Way
- WisDOT-Access Modification

Plus—Like any other building project in the Village—Jackson building permits are required.

We still await the approval from WisDOT for the Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) for the overall impact to STH 60 from the surrounding TID#7.

### AUTUMN CLEANUP DAY

**Saturday, October 17<sup>th</sup>  
9:00 a.m. to Noon**

Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the April annual Village-Wide Spring Clean-up Day was canceled. A one-time-only AUTUMN Cleanup Day has been scheduled for Saturday, October 17<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. until Noon. Village residents may bring bags of leaves or yard waste and household waste (TVs, microwaves, furniture, computers, and metals) to the Street Department, located at W194 N16660 Eagle Drive (just south of Tennies Hardware.) Yard waste should be placed in a biodegradable paper bag. Be prepared to show identification to verify Village of Jackson residency. NO PAINTS, TIRES, BATTERIES, MAJOR APPLIANCES, FREON, OR CONSTRUCTION WASTE WILL BE ACCEPTED.

**Residents may register on that day for access cards to the new Yard Waste Site.**

### WATER MAIN FLUSHING OCTOBER 12—16

The Jackson Water Utility will be flushing the entire water system one week earlier than normal—from Monday, October 12<sup>th</sup> to Friday, October 16<sup>th</sup> between 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

Flushing is performed to improve the quality of your water service. You may experience a temporary interruption in service. If your service is off for more than thirty minutes, please call the Utility office at: 262-677-0707

Water Rate late fees take effect on July 15<sup>th</sup>; so remember to pay your utility bill on time.

Use the Automatic Payment Plan to pay your Sewer and Water bill to avoid late fees.

## From the Desk of the Village President . . .

Freedom. Independence.

Those two words get a lot of lip-service this time of year but usually, not a lot of thought.

It was 1913 when the Federal government was first granted the authority to tax American citizens directly instead of receiving money through the states. That's the same year the practice of the state houses electing Senators ended, being replaced with popular election instead. Ever since, states have been all but powerless to retard the growth of a Federal government as it encroaches on the rights and freedoms of her citizens.

Sadly, most states have joined in on the process themselves.

Almost always in the name of promoting "the public good," the growth and power of our federal, state, and, to some extent, even county and local governments, continues all but unchecked. The cancerous growth in "services" increases the need for additional funding while simultaneously increasing government's ability to dictate and mandate minutiae in almost every aspect of our lives.

Citizens at all levels seem easily bribed with the bounties our governments offer, from birth-to-death meal programs, healthcare programs, rent assistance, energy assistance, and outright cash handouts. We cash the checks (me too!) and enjoy the largesse, conveniently ignoring for a time that in the end, the goodies we receive are always paid for with taxpayer dollars.

Perhaps too little and too late, edicts issued during the COVID-19 scare have begun to help some understand just how far American freedoms have been eroded. From health issues to education, even at the most local levels, we have all but lost the concept of self-determination and rely instead on rampant "gimme-ism."

Since the founding of the country, we have gone from a nation of fiercely independent citizens, to a nation largely dependent on government, and the trend is not likely be reversed any time in the near future.

It's no different at the village level. Sidewalk repair, tree care, drainage issues - we see more and more requests (and demands) for Village services all the time, even as residents and non-residents alike decry the tax levies needed to support the services they insist on receiving.

History shows it takes a lot of hard work, forethought, personal sacrifice, and vigilance to maintain the freedom and independence Americans hold dear. As we've learned from our recent experiences with some of our international trading partners, the cheap and easy path is rarely in our best interest. The more we allow ourselves to be dependent on others, the less freedom we have.

I truly appreciate the many people in our community who have served in the past, and those who continue to think, work, and act on behalf of their community for now and the future. The Village of Jackson continues to be a great community to live, work, and grow. I thank all of you who contribute to our community's success!



Overview of the Site from Atop the Topsoil Pile

# Responding to the 2020 Census without a Census ID

The 2020 Census will be the first time that the public can respond online or by phone, in addition to the traditional paper response. Technology improvements over the last decade that allow for these secure response options also enable the public to respond without a Census Bureau-issued identification number—making it easier to respond anytime, anywhere.

Beginning in mid-March 2020, everyone will receive an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. That invitation will include a unique Census ID that links you to a physical address. But you can also respond online or by phone without a Census ID.

## How do I respond without an ID?

On the 2020 Census response website, select the link under the login button that says, “If you do not have a Census ID, click here.”

## Can I respond online without an ID on any device or browser?

Yes. Responding online without an ID works on most modern devices. For best results use the two latest versions of the following browsers: Internet Explorer, Edge, Chrome, Safari, Firefox, Samsung Native.

## Is my response affected if I don't use a Census ID?

Your Census ID allows us to immediately match your response to an address. If you respond without your Census ID, we'll ask you for your address when you respond so we can link your response to your address.

## How do I provide my address?

When responding online without an ID, there are three options for entering an address:

### 1) STREET ADDRESS

For this option, you will be prompted to enter an address number, street name, and either the city and state or the ZIP Code. If a valid street address isn't available, check the box that says, "I do not have a street address" and you can proceed to enter a rural route address or other address/location (see options below).

### 2) RURAL ROUTE ADDRESS

A rural route address includes a rural route descriptor, rural route number, rural route box ID number, city and state or ZIP Code.

### 3) OTHER ADDRESS/PHYSICAL LOCATION

If you do not have a rural route address, the system will first ask if you are experiencing homelessness. Then, it will invite you to enter a city, state, ZIP Code, and description of the physical place where you live.

## If I live or stay in a garage or added structure at a property, how do I respond?

To respond with a physical location on a property that does not have a separate address, utilize the "Street Address" option, enter the address, and include the description of the structure (e.g., "garage") in the apartment/unit number field. If you reply by phone, you will be prompted to provide the same description.

## How do I respond for multiple people or families at a single address?

Everyone living or staying at an address, even if they are not a member of your family, should be counted by the person filling out the census form for that address. There are no restrictions on the number of people who can be included on your form. The Census Bureau has ways to resolve duplicate responses if multiple people at the same address respond separately.
