## VILLAGE OF JACKSON MUNICIPAL BUILDING

Plans continue for the Village of Jackson's new and long-awaited Municipal Building, which will include the Jackson Police Department, Fire Department, and Village Hall. Look for the groundbreaking to be scheduled for late winter (early 2020.)

## FALL SEASON BRUSH and BAG PICK-UP

Fall brush chipping and bag pick up began Monday, October 7<sup>th</sup>, and will continue each Monday through November 18<sup>th</sup>. **Do not** rake grass or deposit leaves or other yard waste into the street.

The Village Department of Public Works is in the process of constructing a new Yard Waste Site which is scheduled to open in spring of 2020.

## WATER MAIN FLUSHING OCTOBER 21—25

The Jackson Water Utility will be flushing water mains throughout the water service area from October 21<sup>st</sup> to October 25<sup>th</sup>, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

Flushing is performed in the fall and spring to improve the quality of your water service. You may experience a temporary interruption in service. If your service is off for more than thirty minutes, please call the Utility at: 262-677-0707

## JACKSON POLICE DEPARTMENT PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE BACK

**Saturday, October 26<sup>th</sup>, 9:00 a.m. to Noon**

The Jackson Police Department, in cooperation with the Department of Justice (DOA) and Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA), will participate in National Prescription Drug Take Back Day on Saturday, October 26<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. until Noon, outside the garage doors of the Police Department located at N168 W20733 Main Street. An officer will help you dispose of the acceptable items (see list below) – No Questions Asked.

**PLEASE – NO PLASTIC PILL CONTAINERS. Remove all medications from pill containers (except blister packs,) drop into a clear sealable plastic bag, and bring to the Jackson Police Department for disposal.)**

**BRING:** Your unused prescriptions (controlled and non-controlled) and over-the-counter medications, ointments, creams, vials, patches, non-aerosol sprays, inhalers, and pet medications.

**DO NOT BRING:** Illegal drugs, needles/sharps, acids, aerosol cans, bio-hazardous materials (anything containing blood or bodily fluids,) or personal care products (such as shampoo, soaps, lotions, or sunscreens), mercury thermometers, or household hazardous waste (such as paint, pesticides, oil, or gasoline).

## JACKSON FIRE DEPARTMENT

### A few autumn fire safety tips for Fire Pits:

Metal manufactured type fire pits with covers are preferred or fire pits built entirely of noncombustible materials.

No burning within fifteen feet of any building or lot line.

Fire should be under the constant supervision of an adult. Always extinguish fire when finished and then cover fire pit. Contact us with any questions at: 262-677-3811.



## WINTER PARKING RULES

Beginning December 1<sup>st</sup>, on-street parking will be prohibited from 2:00—6:00 a.m. in order to facilitate rapid and economical snow removal. The seasonal parking ban ends April 1<sup>st</sup>. If you have a question about parking, call the Jackson Police Department on the non-emergency line at: 262-677-4949.

## SNOW AND ICE

With winter on the horizon, snowfall in Southeastern Wisconsin, including the Village of Jackson, is bound to occur within the next few months. The Village Code requires that the owner and occupant of each lot or part of lot shall be responsible for *removing all snow and ice* which may have fallen or accumulated upon the full width of the sidewalk in front of their premises not later than twenty-four (24) hours after the snowfall has ceased to fall or accumulate.

Please be neighborly and keep your walks free of snow and ice this winter season.

All dog and cats five months of age or older must be licensed by January 1, 2020. New tags will be available as of December 1, 2019. A copy of the pet's rabies certificate is required before a license will be issued. Dog license fees: Unaltered \$15, Neutered/Spayed \$10.00. Cat license fees: Unaltered \$10.00, Neutered/Spayed \$7.00.

## From the Desk of the Village President . . .

Great news! Jackson Drive is scheduled to be paved and open October 18<sup>th</sup>. I think we're all looking forward to that!

The Jackson Drive construction process – and the challenges accompanying it – reminded me that some people are really good complainers!

Good complainers know how to get their point across and encourage positive action without being rude, derogatory, sexist, bigoted, overly emotional, or resorting to hyperbole. It's quickly apparent they're kind, gracious, and legitimately concerned about more than their own self interests. They understand the difference between accomplishing something positive and just venting.

If you have concerns with things from time to time, here are a few ideas to help achieve positive resolutions in every area of your life:

**Care at least as much about your concern as you expect someone else to** – Am I willing to be the solution to my own complaint? If my pet peeve is trash, am I willing to pick it up? If it's weeds, am I willing to pull them? Am I willing to do legitimate research on the issues that are important to me? If I lack the motivational wherewithal to make a difference about my concern, how can I expect someone else to do it for me?

**Sign your name!** – This goes back to the first item. If my concern isn't important enough for me to attach my name to, it must not be very important. Anonymous donations to your favorite charities achieve favorable results. Anonymous complaints rarely do.

**Keep vendettas out of it** – Some items are legitimate concerns that *should* be raised for the good of the community. Sometimes, though, complaints are the obvious result of personal vendettas. If the real purpose of my complaint is to "get back at" someone, or "shut them up," I need to reconsider whether my complaint is legitimate.

**Be polite** – Our staff, volunteers, paid-on-call personnel, and elected officials are genuinely good-hearted people interested in helping our residents and in making the Village of Jackson the best it can be. It's simply not in my best interest to be rude to the people who can help me.

**Document the concern** – Tom Clancy wrote in one of his novels, "If it wasn't written down, it never happened." If I'm concerned about specific events, I need to write down dates and times when things happen. Just about everybody has a cell phone these days; take pictures! Feel free to use the "Citizen Complaint Form" on the Village website. Under the Permits and Forms tab, click on the Building Inspection pulldown menu. The Citizen Complaint Form about ¾ of the way down the list is a concise, easy way to record your concern in an actionable way.

**Keep hyperbole out of it** – Is the thing really "always" or "never" happening? Does "everyone" really agree with me? Maybe they're just being polite with me as I go off on a rant and it's not really as big a deal as I've made it out to be in my own mind. Be honest (especially with yourself) about the circumstances.

**Be patient** – We might think a casual comment in the checkout line at Piggly Wiggly or the plumbing aisle at Tennies will get our concern resolved. We might think this type of casual comment absolves us of any further responsibility.

In reality it's likely that, despite their best intentions, the person we're talking with is more concerned about what they're going to serve for supper in half an hour, or how to get the toilet to stop leaking before it ruins the flooring.

Along the same lines, there are budgetary and human resource limits to what can be done. Village administration and department heads work hard to present responsible annual budgets (yes, it's that time of year again!) for approval by the Village Board.

The Village's portion of property taxes is allotted to the various departments to carry out the work prioritized by the various boards and committees during the months-long budget process. Budgets are based on typical year expenses, and while there may be a little bit of flexibility, the Village departments are forced to live both within the constraints of their budgets and the priorities set for them by the various boards.

That means, even when your suggestion is really good, there might not be the manpower or funding to do it as quickly you'd like.

Plans for the municipal building are being finalized as staff collaborates with the engineering group to achieve layouts that will serve the community for years to come!

Thanks to everyone helping make the Village of Jackson the best it can be!
