Subject: Weekly Update



Police Department

Officers attended in-service training at Waukesha County Technical College this week. The topics included: Officer Involved Shooting De-brief, Personal and Professional Breakthroughs, and Active Shooter/ School Safety.

Our department is participating in the State-wide “Click it or Ticket” enforcement campaign through June 2nd. In 2017, there were 10,076 unbuckled passenger vehicle occupants killed in crashes in the United States. Almost fifty-seven percent of young adults (18-34) killed in crashes were completely unrestrained, and fifty-nine percent of pickup truck occupants killed were not buckled up. In 2017, fifty-one percent of men killed in crashes were not buckled up, compared to thirty-nine percent of women. To help prevent crash fatalities, cops across the nation will be stepping up enforcement from May 20 to June 2 to ensure that motorists are wearing their seat belts; because there's no excuse good enough for not buckling up.

Officer Gerke attended Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program (MCSAP) in-service training this week. The training is required to maintain her certification to perform DOT inspections of commercial motor vehicles in the Village.

Sixty background checks for operator’s licenses to serve fermented malt beverages and intoxicating liquors were completed.

Fire Department

There were twelve medical and two fire calls over the last week, including a CO call and a grass fire.

Training continues on the new ladder truck. Monday and Tuesday a Pierce Manufacturing training representative spent a total of twelve hours conducting training on the use of the truck. Work continues on the process of mounting the remaining equipment in the appropriate locations.

The JFD is getting closer to transitioning to a paramedic level of service. The anticipated goal is the end of summer. We await approval of one of the licenses from the Drug Enforcement Division (DEA.) Once received, the operational plan will be referred to our Medical Control doctor for approval and then sent to the state for review.

Joint Parks and Recreation

The Splash Park and New Inclusive Playground will not open this weekend for the season. With warm dry weather, surfacing of the playground will be able to be completed soon. Check the Park & Rec Facebook page for updates. It will be well worth the wait!

The American Red Cross blood drive on Wednesday yielded twenty-three units of blood. The next drive is scheduled for Monday, June 24th (Versiti Blood Center of Wisconsin); then July 24th (American Red Cross); both scheduled for 2:00 – 6:00 p.m. Check the Activity Guide for appointment/walk-in details.

The 4k Graduation Ceremonies were held on Thursday in Hickory Lane Park. Kudos to the teachers for putting on a memorable event for the kiddos and their parents.

Thanks to Paula Winter, the Village employees were able to complete an in-house health screening at the JACC on Thursday. This is part of the StayWell and Village Wellness Programs.

Building Inspection

Inspection volume was steady this week. The weather continues to impact certain projects.

The Jackson Family Dental renovation project is scheduled for final inspection today (Friday).

The Building Inspector met with Reliable Door Company, who replaced the double doors in the Community Center gymnasium, to detail the hardware requirements in order to maintain egress requirements and overall functionality. The original replacements were not compliant.

Rough inspections were completed on the most recent 8-family building in the Twin Bridges condominium development. They are now moving into the insulation and drywall stages.

Public Works

The Jackson Water Utility has completed the preparation for the opening of the Hickory Park Splash Pad for the season, which must now be delayed (due to the rain) until the new inclusive play area is ready. Meter changeouts, valve exercising, Digger's Hotline locates, programming of water meters to one gallon, and hydrant maintenance some of the items worked on this past week.

The Street & Parks Department crew picked up curbside yard waste bags and chipped brush this week (until the end of May.) Progress is being made in spite of the rainy weather for the landscaping around new playground. The rubber matting installation will hopefully be completed next week. A CVMIC safety meeting was held Wednesday, with discussion on hearing protection and bloodborne pathogens. Flags and banner were installed along Main Street. Mowing continued in the drier areas of the parks. Cold patching potholes and tree planting are scheduled for next week.

Wednesday the Wastewater Plant hosted a tour of the plant for eighty-five students from Germantown High School. The crew acid-washed the cloth filters and replaced the damaged ones. The odor control system was maintained to raise the efficiency level to 100%.

Annual licensing applications have been streaming in for the new year beginning July 1st.

Jilline participated in a Wisconsin Election Commission webinar on Tuesday regarding the last election cycle and what's in store for the rest of 2019.

Treasurer
