Subject: Weekly Update



Police Department

The Washington County I.T. staff visited this week to review our network in advance of transitioning to the ProPhoenix records management program. The launch date has been targeted for late June. Details are being finalized prior to joining the system also used by the Sheriff's Office and the West Bend and Germantown Police Departments.

A Thursday afternoon single-vehicle traffic crash on the USH 45 off-ramp resulted in injuries to a 38-year-old Germantown man. The driver was treated at the scene with Narcan and transported to a local hospital. Charges for OWI and other traffic violations are pending.

The 2019 squad car was delivered to General Communications in Milwaukee for the new equipment to be installed. The squad should be ready for patrol by next week.

The Police and Fire Commission met Wednesday evening to interview the five internal candidates for our sergeant position. More details will be shared next week.

The Memorial Day weekend was particularly busy for the police department with five suspects from separate incidents being taken to the county jail.

Fire Department

There were ten medical and four fire calls over the last week including a smoke detector alarm, CO alarm, a pull station activation, and a single motor vehicle crash on the northbound off-ramp of USH 45 at STH 60. The vehicle had lost control and rolled onto its side. The driver was transported to Froedtert Hospital in Wauwatosa. The crash is still under investigation.

Training continued in familiarizing all the firefighters with the new ladder truck. A new member is beginning the EMT Basic class and two members are finishing up schooling for MPO and Firefighter I.

Thursday a couple members spent the day touring different departments to establish a new "drug bag" for the upcoming paramedic service upgrade. The operational plan continues to progress.

The Fire station committee is progressing on plan updates to the municipal building.

Joint Parks and Recreation

The Washington County Convention & Visitors Bureau held its Annual Meeting and Dinner Tuesday evening at the History Center of Washington County. Anne Sayers, Deputy Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Tourism was the guest speaker. Elaine Motl, CVB Executive Director, gave the Annual Report.

Tuesday was the last day of class for the 4k program. The JACC will now get ready to begin summer programming June 10th.

Wednesday morning the JACC hosted the district-wide 4k teacher and staff end of the year appreciation breakfast. Each partnership site was given the opportunity to present the highlights of their school year.

The Splash Park opened this morning at 10:00 a.m.

Building Inspection

Inspection volume slowed this week. A good part of the week was spent organizing and cleaning up computer files.

An occupancy application was filed by Elevate, Inc. for a tenant space on Prairie View Lane in the Tillie Lake Business Park.

A number of property maintenance orders were issued pertaining to lawn and building maintenance.

Public Works

The Jackson Water Utility has the Hickory Park Splash Pad ready for the season – opening today. Meter changeouts, valve exercising, Digger's Hotline locates, programming meters to the gallon, and maintenance on the hydrants were worked on this past week. The water service at the new condo building on Stonebrook Drive was changed from a 2-inch to a 6-inch service. The unused 4-inch water service on Tower Drive was removed from the system. The new storage buildings did not require water service.

The Street & Parks Department crew continued with curbside yard waste bags and brush chipping this week. The next curbside pickup is the week of June 17th. The rainy weather Progress has slowed the progress of landscaping around the new playground in Hickory Lane Park. Installation of the rubber matting will hopefully be completed this weekend. The focus now turns to getting Jackson Park ready for Action in Jackson. A new fryer was purchased for the Jackson Park kitchen and will be installed next week. Fire extinguishers have been inspected for the Village Hall and park buildings; utility buildings and vehicles are next.

At the WWTP: The crew jetted and videotaped the sewers in Hickory Lane and Chateau Drive prior to the planned reconstruction projects. The sewer lateral serving the property at the corner of Industrial and Tower Drives was removed from the 12-inch main. After removal and patching, the line was videotaped and was found to be leaking. A company is being sought to seal the lateral by grouting from inside the pipe. Another planning meeting was held for the "Cedar Creek Day – Improving Land for Cleaner Waters" event to be held Saturday, September 7th from 1:00 – 5:00 p.m. The event is free and open to the public. It will be held at the newly purchased property on STH 60 – the location where the new Village Municipal Building will be built. Cereal rye has been planted in the fields for the event, and is growing nicely.
