Subject: Weekly Update



### **Police Department**

Last Friday, unlicensed peddlers for a window improvement company were told to leave town, and their manager was cited. Our residents have become very aware of the permit requirement, and call the police station to check when peddlers are hitting the neighborhoods. Notices are put on the Police Department's Facebook page when permits are issued.

At about 3:00 a.m. Sunday, a 27-year-old Chestnut Court man ran his motorcycle into the curb on Ridgeway Drive, and was pinned underneath. He crawled out and ran home, leaving the cycle running. Witnesses directed Officer Borkowski, assisted by deputies, to the man's apartment. Jackson Rescue was called to take the injured man to the hospital. He was arrested for OWI-1<sup>st</sup> Offense.

A Green Valley man, 26, with whom we are familiar, was arrested last Friday evening for disorderly conduct and criminal damage to property, in connection with a fight with his girlfriend. A few hours after he was booked, he tried calling the woman from the county jail, violating the 72-hour no-contact order.

### **Fire Department**

There were twenty medical and three fire calls this week, including a car fire on USH 45, a motorcycle accident, and a natural gas leak.

For training Monday evening, the Flight for Life Helicopter landed at the Town of Jackson garage to review procedures with the fire department for site landings. They also reviewed the protocol for when they should be summoned to a scene. Members of the Sheriff's Department and Washington County dispatch also participated. Thank you to Flight for Life and the Sheriff's department for their assistance.

It was determined at the monthly meeting on the subject of strokes that Jackson's program is in total compliance for 2018. Work continues in order to remain at the top of the class. Next week will be spent developing the recruitment campaign. If you know anyone that would like to become an EMT and/or a firefighter, this would be a great opportunity to join the fire department.

### **Joint Parks and Recreation**

Kelly met with Brian Kober and with Ericka Stelz from Northland Recreation to begin the project timeline for the Inclusive Playground, to ensure the rubber surface will be poured by early November at the latest. There will be another planning on Monday, July 16<sup>th</sup>.

The JACC hosted a pizza party for the Silverbrook Drama Program and kids that donated \$2,545.00 toward the Inclusive Playground in the memory of Matthew Beekman. Friends President Casey Latz was in attendance to graciously accept the check.

Our newest Eagle Scout, Dylan Goggins had his parent meeting with Kelly on Thursday afternoon to determine a project that will fit his passions and talents. More to come . . .

Youth tennis lessons began on Thursday in Jackson Park.

Recent Repairs Update: The lock on the Jackson Park Concession Stand had to be replaced; the eastside double gym doors are being reconfigured from a middle bar locking system to a frame locking system, eliminating the middle bar, due to numerous issues that have evolved; the front flag pole flood lights are being repaired, along with the exterior building lights, front bollards, and seven gym light ballasts. Kelly is not looking forward to receiving this invoice.

### **Building Inspection**

Inspection requests and complaint investigations have been very busy, leaving minimal plan review time.

### **Public Works**

The Jackson Water Utility helped the Washington County Fair Park staff fill a large water tank for a dog show. Broken water valves were repaired this week. Asphaltting will be done along with the sanitary sewer lateral repairs. Wednesday was customer water disconnection day. With 160 units on the initial list totaling \$53,931.22 in uncollected revenue, forty-four customers were finally turned off. Sixty-seven multi-family tenants were unable to be disconnected; and forty-one customers began payment plans. A manager at an apartment/condo complex illegally turned the water services back on after they had been shut off. He felt it was unfair the people were not notified. The water and sewer bill was sent April 15<sup>th</sup>. After two months of nonpayment, a disconnection notice was sent ten days prior to the disconnection day. The manager was informed that he had tampered with the meter, and will be fined accordingly.

The Street & Parks Department continues normal mowing and ball field prep. Brush was chipped and bags were picked this week. The next chipping and bag picking is set for the week of July 23<sup>rd</sup>. Line painting is being scheduled for the week of July 9<sup>th</sup>. The crew is spraying weeds in the parks, Village-owned buildings, and on Main Street. The tar has been delivered for the annual crack filling program. The tower on top of the Village Hall has been inspected for the beginning of the removal process.

At the WWTP: The sanitary lateral was repaired at a house in Valleywood Subdivision. The crew then jetted the sewer line. A sanitary lateral was also repaired on Willow Ridge. All leaking sanitary laterals on the Utility's side found during videoing have now been repaired. Asphalt patching is being scheduled.

Asphaltting and landscaping of the Stonehedge Drive storm sewer, Highland Road water main, and Sherman Road sanitary projects have been completed. Water and sewer mains are being installed on Rosewood Lane in the TID #6 development project.

The Ridgeway Drive reconstruction project has two crews working: one is doing water main, and the other is installing sanitary sewer laterals. A one-inch gas service line was hit on Thursday.
