Re: Weekly Update



Police Department

Officer Gerke successfully completed the three-day Wisconsin Department of Justice Rifle Instructor Course this week at Waukesha County Technical College. She is now certified to provide instruction and training to JPD staff on our patrol rifles.

Officer Trevarthen and Detective Foeger received commendations for their actions regarding an incident on July 15th. They responded to a call of a suicidal person armed with a box cutter, who had cut his own neck and wrist and refused to drop the box cutter. The two officers risked their own safety and stabilized the man's arms, prying the box cutter from his hand. Their actions safely de-escalated the situation without further injury to the man, themselves, or any bystanders.

On Saturday evening officers observed a subject who they believed had a warrant for his arrest. The man denied being the person who had a warrant. After further questioning and investigation it was determined that the man was lying about his identity and was arrested.

On Tuesday evening an officer observed a vehicle backing unsafely in a roundabout on Main Street. The officer stopped the vehicle and could smell the odor of burnt marijuana in the car. A marijuana cigarette and drug paraphernalia were located. The driver was cited for operating with a suspended driver's license, unsafe backing, and possession of THC (marijuana.)

Fire Department

It was a busy week with twenty-two medical calls and a call for an alarm activation at Comfort Inn & Suites. This week's training involved EMS/fire training, utilizing the Village's Wastewater Treatment Plant for some confined space training and removal of patients from this type of location.

There have been a number of recent bee stings, some causing anaphylactic shock – an extreme allergic reaction to an antigen to which the body has become hypersensitive. If you get stung and begin having a hard time breathing, DIAL 911.

Mask usage will be mandatory beginning tomorrow (August 1st) at the Jackson Area Community Center, Park Shelters, Playgrounds, and Splash Park (when not using the water features), per the statewide Mandatory Mask Order (a.k.a. Office of the Governor Emergency Order #1) issued by Governor Tony Evers. Despite COVID-19, we are able to run many of our programs following the COVID-19 guidelines. Things are going very well. We anticipate that this will continue until we can fully open things back up.

The Glo Run for October 10th has been canceled. The decision will be made in mid-August for the Ghoul Gala and Kids Rummage sale.

The CVB Board (Visit Washington County) will begin its first round of Strategic Planning on Thursday, with the final two sessions scheduled for September and October. The goal is to have the plan wrapped up by the end of the year.

Building Inspection

Permit and inspection volume remained heavy this week.

Final occupancy was granted to Global Parts Solutions on North Center Street and final occupancy inspections were completed on the remaining units at Sherman Heights Apartments.

Event Horizons Tattoo Shop has closed and vacated their leased space on South Center Street.

Daily inspections have been occurring at the Municipal Complex site. Significant progress has been made on interior underground plumbing and footing/foundation work. Roughly 950 linear feet of footings have been installed along with approximately 700 linear feet of foundation wall. Perimeter foundation work will be completed next week with interior footing work to follow.

Public Works

At the Jackson Water Utility: Well #3 rehab has begun. The pump has been pulled and the well has been videoed. The next step is to pump water to waste in order to remove the sand. Water main has been installed along Cedar Creek Road from Jackson Drive to Hidden Creek Court and has successfully passed the pressure test and safe water sample. The final connection was made on Thursday. Meter changeout notices have been sent to the next batch of customers. Eight of twenty-three appointments have been scheduled. A call was received over the weekend for water bubbling out of the ground in Green Valley. Investigation revealed a leaking fitting on the customer's side. Green Valley's maintenance crew repaired the leak.

At the Street & Parks Department: Ninety-seven Yard Waste Site access cards have been issued to Village residents. Call 262-677-0707 for information on how to get yours. Curbside bag and brush chipping has been completed for July. The list of catch basin and sidewalk repairs has been completed by TP Concrete. Restoration will continue with the Street Department crew. The foul ball net has been put up at Jackson Park.

At the WWTP: Clarifier #3 is being jetted and videoed this week. The chlorine pump required replacement. Boiler maintenance for the digester was completed this week. The Fire Department held a training using one the emptied clarifier tanks on Monday.

The parking lot at the new Municipal Complex site was graded this week. Footings are now being installed on the site. Onsite water main is now complete after passing the continuity test. Water main and sanitary sewer have been installed in the Spruce Street extension.

Clerk

Voter registration and in-person absentee voting continues next week: Monday (August 3rd) to Thursday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and on Friday (August 7th) from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.

The Public Test of the voting equipment for the Partisan Primary Election is scheduled for next Tuesday, August 4th and is open to the public.

Treasurer

The second installment of property tax payments is due today (July 31st.) These payments must be made payable to and sent to the Washington County Treasurer's Office.

The Village received several State Aid Payments on Monday including Exempt Computer Municipal Aid of \$20,689.13 and TID Exempt Computer Aid of \$5,087.62.

Department contractors have made significant progress on WIS 60 construction since early June. Bridge deck replacement and deck overlay at Cedar Creek is complete. All new curb at all intersections will be complete at the end of this week. With the exception of roundabout construction at County Y, lower layers of asphalt are complete between WIS 181 and County G (Division Rd.). Grading and restoration continues moving to the west project limits and again - with the exception of the roundabout at County Y - All grading will be complete by early August.

The intersection of County Y closed to all traffic on June 8th and is currently scheduled to re-open prior to Labor Day. All grading and storm sewer were complete in mid July. Curb, approach island, and truck turning apron have all been placed and all underground electrical and bases for approach lighting are complete.

Three Week Look Ahead (Weather Dependent)

Week of August 3rd

- Grading bridge approaches at Cedar Creek
- Guard rail installation project wide

Week of August 10th

- Restoration west project limits to Maple Rd., guard rail installation – project wide
- Pavement removal/milling, pavement repairs – County G to West project limits
- Complete lower all lower layers of asphalt pavement west of County G. Verify/test upper layer placement of asphalt near County G
- Pave lower layers of asphalt - County Y Roundabout.

Week of August 17th

- Begin paving of upper/surface layers of asphalt pavement. Anticipate 10 working days to complete pavement placement.
- Continue guard rail installation and final restoration.

Traffic Impacts/Detours:

The department continues to monitor traffic conditions and speeds on detour and adjacent routes. Appreciate patience of local traffic when approaching contractor operations and using nearest available north south routes to access WIS 60.





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
