Subject: Weekly Update



Police Department

The Attorney General's Office has requested a significant amount of data relating to emergency detentions from law enforcement agencies across the state. Jodi and Susie dedicated many hours to gather the needed information for 2017 and 2018. It was submitted to the state this week.

We met with the new principal at Jackson Elementary School, Darci VanAdestine this week to review safety planning, traffic flows, etc.

Chief Vossekul attended the Bureau of Transportation's Law Enforcement Luncheon on Thursday in Wisconsin Dells. Agencies that participate in the traffic safety initiatives throughout the year are invited to attend and are entered for drawings for police equipment. Unfortunately, we weren't selected for an equipment grant this year.

Jackson PD has agreed to serve as the lead agency and liaison to the state for the Bureau of Transportation Safety traffic grants. We were notified last week that we are being targeted for an additional safety grant for 2019-2020. Lieutenant Fristed has taken the lead on this initiative which has resulted in additional state-funded traffic enforcement details. Our partner agencies are the West Bend Police Department, Slinger Police Department and the Washington County Sheriff's Department.

Calls for service are on the upswing. On Thursday evening, officers were dispatched to a domestic disturbance on Clover Lane. While the officers were walking up to the residence, they heard a loud bang initially thought to be a gunshot. Police officers from our neighboring jurisdictions responded as well. Ultimately, it was determined that a juvenile lit a firecracker inside the residence and no shots were fired. Officers obtained a search warrant for the residence and a large amount of drug paraphernalia as well as marijuana and other controlled substances were seized. Charges are pending.

Fire Department

There were seventeen medical and two fire calls this past week, including assisting the sheriff's department in locating a missing driver who had struck a telephone pole; and a motor vehicle crash on USH 45 with three injured. Twenty-two fire inspections were performed: six retail/mercantile, fourteen multi-family dwellings, a final occupancy, a hydro test, and a final inspection on a sprinkler system.

Monday night training was aerial operations and hydrant hooks. Catching a hydrant on a way to a fire is very important. Without water hooked up to the engines, you will run out of water in minutes. The faster we get at this, the safer our members are and the likelihood of saving the residence increases.

Nineteen members are enrolled in school this next semester: ten in State Certification Aerial, three in EMT Basic, one in Fire fighter I, two in Fire fighter II, one in instructor I, and two in Instructor II.

Schools are being contacted for Fire Prevention week. We have ordered new materials for the children and are planning our open house.

Donation letters are being distributed to Village businesses. Donations received will go towards purchasing a fire extinguisher training system, ultimately saving companies considerable expense. The system costs approximately \$15,000. We ask everyone to help us out in any way possible.

Joint Parks and Recreation

Thanks to everyone who stepped up to help with the Augtoberfest Beer Garden. It's always so nice to see the community come together. The weather for tonight and tomorrow evening's wrap-up should be spectacular.

The sponsor monument for the Hickory Inclusive Playground is in production. Thanks to the design team of Cost of Wisconsin for their passion and excitement for this special project.

Cleaning, painting, and sanitizing continues at the JACC to get ready for fall/winter activities.

Officials from the City of West Bend met with the Park & Rec to tour the new Inclusive Playground and gather information, as they have a group interested in building a similar park in West Bend.

The Thursday night adult volleyball league ended its season this week. The adult softball league completed its season with only one rainout! The Wednesday night adult softball league will end September 4th.

Building Inspection

Inspection volume was steady this week while permit volume decreased.

Foundations for the house on English Oaks Drive and condo projects on Stonebrook Drive are completed. Framing will begin next week.

Various property maintenance letters concerning illegal vehicles, dilapidated buildings, lawn maintenance, and refuse storage were issued.

Staff has been working with DSPS on required changes to our ordinances as they relate to the electrical code and our Electrical Inspection Agency Registration. These changes will be placed on the September Village Board Agenda.

Public Works

The Jackson Water Utility discovered a leaking hydrant valve on Center Street this week; The hydrant and valve were replaced Friday. Staff members attended the annual WRWA Outdoor Expo on Thursday.

The Street & Parks Department chipped brush and picked bags all week. Jackson Park was set up for the Beer Garden in the Park. Truck maintenance is being done on the 5-yard patrol trucks followed by DOT inspections, with the help from the Jackson PD. Line painting is scheduled for next week beginning with the school zone.

At the WWTP: The secondary clarifiers have been repaired and are back online. Sludge hauling from the blue tank was done this week, lowering the level to five feet. It will be totally emptied in fall. During the sludge removal operation, the #2 sludge pump blew a gasket and shot sludge inside the sludge building. The crew spent a half-day cleaning the building. The sludge hauler will be charged for the cleanup.

The grading has been completed in the Laurel Springs Subdivision. Sanitary sewer installation comes next. Completion of Jackson Drive and Cedar Creek Road is still planned to occur prior to completing the Subdivision. Work continues with the town; it has to go out to public bid for its portion of the road project.

A pre-construction meeting for Hickory Lane, Chateau Drive, and Jackson Alley projects has been scheduled for Wednesday, September 4th. The contractor is planning to begin the project in the second week of September. . . details to follow.

Clerk

Treasurer

Registration information was sent to all eligible employees for the Oct 16th Flu Shot Clinic. There are twenty available spots with the option to add more if needed.

Westbury Bank set up the processing system for the Village to make remote deposits. We will begin using this system to make deposits more quickly and eliminate daily trips to the bank.

The State Group Insurance Board approved an overall 4% health insurance premium increase for 2020. This equates to an approximate increase of \$1-3 per month for individual coverage and approximately \$3-8 per month for family coverage. They also approved no changes for the Group Life Insurance premiums for 2020.
