Police Department

Jackson PD officers attended county-wide active shooter training in West Bend this week. It was a valuable opportunity to review our procedures and work with other Washington County law enforcement agencies.

Fire Department

There were ten medical and two fire calls this week, including a one car rollover on STH 60 at Maple Road. The other fire call was a fire alarm.

The week's training involved National Incident Management System (NIMS) training, which is a comprehensive, nationwide systematic approach to incident management.

We also toured the Venerable Fire Collection museum in Slinger featuring a broad history of the fire service. The museum is open the second Sunday of the month from 1:00 – 5:00 p.m. from May – October.

There will be a Public Interest Meeting scheduled in the near future to help with the revision and long-term planning of the Village of Jackson Parks & Open Space Plan. The Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (SEWRPC) will provide the GIS mapping and statistical updates. The goal is to have the plan before the Village Board in November for approval so it can be submitted to the DNR for final approval by the end of the year to keep our eligibility for grants.

The Fall/Winter Indoor Pickleball schedule will begin September 4th and run Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:30 a.m. to Noon for more competitive play, and from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursday for beginners and recreational-paced players.

Building Inspection

Footings were begun for the building addition at Infinity EDM on Northwest Passage.

A final inspection was completed at Accord Manufacturing for interior alterations inside the warehouse.

Complaint follow-ups continue.

Public Works

The Jackson Water Utility: The crew climbed the white tower to replace the aircraft warning lights. All valve boxes were checked and adjusted for the CTH P, Ridgeway Drive, and the paving projects. The water mains associated with the TIF #6 project were flushed and placed online. The chlorine valve at the Splash Pad has been replaced.

The Street & Parks Department had the major task of bags and brush chipping this week. Chipping lasted until Friday. A temporary repair has been made to the storm inlet at Georgetown and Jackson Drives next to the crosswalk by the elementary school. The street millings from the Stonewall paving project were shared with a few businesses, and the rest will be used for the Inclusive Playground project and the bulk water road at the new public works building. The crew mowed Hickory Park prior to setup for the circus.

At the WWTP: Sludge hauling from the blue tank has been completed, with two feet remaining in the tank. The lab cabinet project has minor items to be completed. The equipment is being transferred back to the lab. The crew checked the manholes for the Stonewall paving project.

Zenith Tech is installing curbing in the Ridgeway Drive reconstruction project. Sidewalk installation is next along with the driveway approaches. The new project plan is to have the entire project paved by mid-September.

Sidewalk has been installed in the Rosewood Lane project (TID #6), with the sidewalk to follow.

The asphalt pulverizing has been completed in the paving project for Stonewall and English Oaks Drives. Fine grading is scheduled for Monday, followed by the final paving. Weather permitting, the project should be completed by Friday, August 31st.
